Welcome to the June 2010 newsletter!

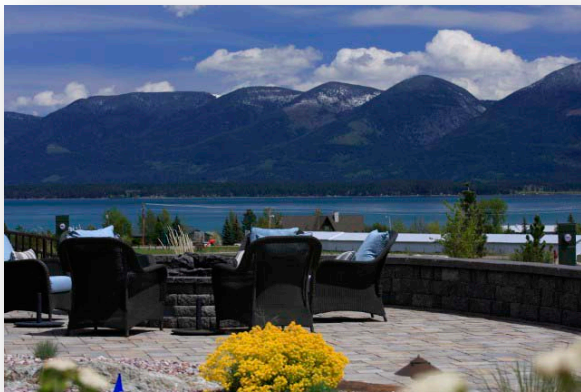

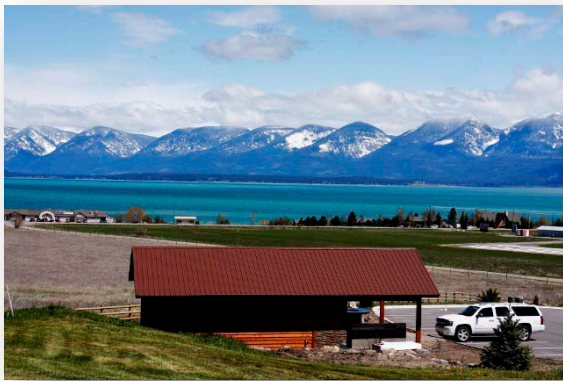

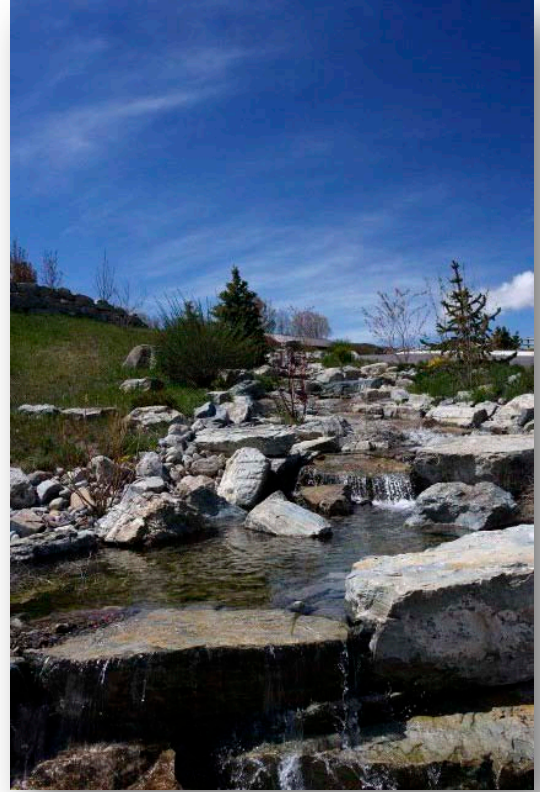
Phase 2 getting ready for the sod. You should see it now!

We are adding new features each year like the pond below. As soon as the landscaping is finished and the water clears up, we hope it will be a favorite place to visit on your walks through the Resort.



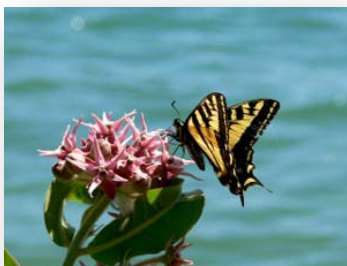

Glacier National Park celebrates 100 years

Glacier National Park celebrated its Centennial Commemoration from 1910 – 2010 which was exactly 100 years on May 11 after President William Howard Taft signed the legislation creating Glacier National Park on May 11.

During the recent celebration at West Glacier where over 1,000

Montanans attended, including Lieutenant Governor John Bohlinger said “Had Congress not established the national park system, places like Glacier would have been sold to the highest bidder,” Bohlinger said, noting the area’s designation as a Forest Reserve 10 years before it became the 10th national park, and its establishment as an International Peace Park in 1932. That same year also marked the completion of the Going-to-the-Sun Road, arguably the park’s biggest attraction.



The park has planned a wide variety of activities throughout the summer that can be viewed by going to the park’s website at www.glaciercentennial.org.

One exhibit of particular adventurous interest is called 100 Years of Bears in Many Glacier at Many Glacier, Glacier National Park all day on Friday, June 4.

Glacier National Parks story would not be complete without a look at the bears of Glacier Park. Join the park for day hikes with expert naturalist and author, Ralph Waltdt, to learn about bear biology, habitat and foods, and spring emergence from the den. They hope to catch a glimpse of one of these impressive animals by making frequent stops along the trail and roads to glass mountain sides and avalanche chutes. Reservations are required. 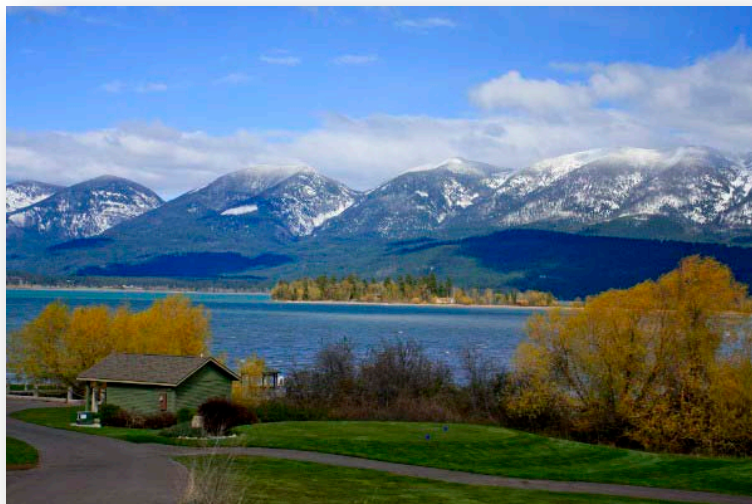


Polson Bay Golf Course Hole #6
